

Who Qualified as a Farmworker

- Majority of income - at least 51% - derived from agricultural employment, At any time within the past 24 months, or prior retirement or disability.
- Migratory - Moves for employment - "Established a temporary abode (home) for purposes of employment."
- Seasonal - Does not move for employment - "Does not establish a temporary abode for purposes of employment"
Works seasonally, not year round
- Includes family members who rely on farmworker's income
- Includes retired or disabled ex farmworkers

2013 HRSA UDS Manual

- Agriculture includes farming as defined by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), including workers included in the following codes and all sub-codes within:
 - 111 - Crop Production (Seeds, grain, nuts, vegetables, fruit, greenhouse, nursery, floriculture, tobacco, sugarcane)
 - 112 - Animal Production and Aquaculture (Cattle, pigs, poultry, sheep, goats, fish, horses)
 - Aquaculture includes fish hatcheries and shell fish farms
 - 1151 and 1152

NAICS Code 1151 and 1152

Support activities for agriculture and forestry (Support for crops, animals or forestry)

- Soil preparation
- Planting
- Harvesting
- Preparing
- Processing
- Producing
- Farm management (contract or fee basis)
- Labor contracting
- Collecting pinestraw
- Animal boarding or breeding
- Cleaning animal stalls

Identification and Documentation of MSFW 9

Not included in "Agriculture"

- Landscaping and lawn maintenance
- Land clearing
- Buying or selling farm products
- People who migrate for other reasons (such as work in construction, road building or other non agricultural employment - And don't work in agriculture)
- Year round (not seasonal) workers
- Livestock transportation
- Meat production
- Spectator sporting industry (race horses)
